DETERMINATION OF DELIVERABLES: Two sculptures have been subjected to extreme environmental conditions due to unsuitable materials. 2)

OUTCOMES: The restoration of two CPS Art Collection works of art are need of conservation treatment to stabilize them for future generations of students.
