



(2) Loss of staff time to accommodate student religious needs is both a burden to the school

and staff time shall be required to monitor or supervise a student's religious activities. Therefore, requests for accommodations which would require staff supervision should be denied.

(3) In order to be granted a religious accommodation, a student's parent or legal guardian

(4) To the extent possible, students should fulfill their religious obligations during lunch or a free
