PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: College Bridge is a program designed to serve well qualified and highly motivated CPS high school juniors and seniors, and to encourage them to pursue a college

education. The students are enrolled in the Chicago Public Schools and in one of approximately 200 courses available at participating colleges and universities. These Courses are in the areas of behavioral/social sciences, science, English, foreign languages, math, computer science, and fine arts. The students will receive both high school credit weighted equal to advanced placement courses, and undergraduate college credit for courses that they successfully complete.

PROGRAM OUTCOMES: The primary outcomes for the College Bridge Program are to enable

high school elective credit, enrich these students' academic and experiential background, and increase their opportunities for being accepted into four-year college degree programs and receiving
