



# About Local School Councils

The Chicago School Reform Act of 1988 created Local School Councils with the intent of improving academic achievement by placing the primary responsibility for school governance and improvement in the hands of parents, community, residents, teachers, and the school principal at the school level.

Most LSCs are made up of 6 parents, 2 community members, 2 teachers, 1 non-teaching staff, 3 students for HS, and the school's principal. Next year 1 student for ES.

Local School Councils are responsible for:

Approving how school funds and resources are allocated.

# 2022 LSC Elections Goals

Recruit 8,200 Candidates

Fill 6,241 Candidate Seats Across 509 schools

Recruit 1,600 Election Judges

As of February 17th, we have received 318 candidate applications and 355 judges applications.
